

Dear Armstrong Families,

Thank you to our families for attending the Founder's Day picnic last Friday! It is a great celebration of a successful beginning of our school year at Armstrong. It is difficult to believe that we have completed the first nine weeks of the 25-26 school year! I want to provide a reminder that report cards grades will be available in Skyward on Friday, October 17. The district grading system and report cards have been updated this school year based on parent and educator feedback. I will discuss this in more detail next Wednesday, October 22 at All Things Armstrong, but here is a brief explanation of the standards-based reporting scale:

- **4**: The student consistently demonstrates understanding and application of the standard. Work is accurate, complete, and independent. (This student knows this content so well that they could TEACH it.)
- **3**: The student demonstrates understanding and application of the standard with minimal errors. Work is generally accurate and complete, showing readiness to move forward. (This student in on grade level with this content.)
- 2: The student demonstrates partial understanding of the standard but may lack consistency or accuracy. Errors or misconceptions are present, and support is sometimes needed to complete tasks. (Some of the content may also still be in the process of being taught/learned.)
- 1: The student demonstrates limited understanding of the standard. Work is often incomplete, inaccurate, or requires significant support. The student is not yet meeting grade-level expectations.

I also want to be clear that grading may not be consistently equivalent through the entire year. For example, in the area of phonics, a student may score at a 3 for the beginning quarter, with simple content such as reading CVC words. However, that same student may be struggling during the second quarter, due to the phonics content becoming more challenging, such as using diagraphs. Due to the increased level of

difficulty, this student might score a 2 in the area of phonics. It depends upon the individual student. At the bottom of the report card, there will be a key with an explanation of grading for core subjects and Specials.

Report cards, assessment data, and individual student needs and responses will be discussed at parent-teacher conferences in the coming weeks. Please feel free to contact me or your child's classroom teacher for more information. We are so proud of our students and their teachers!



- We would like to encourage everyone to bring healthy snacks to school and to participate in the fun dress-up days.




