Dear Parents,

I hope everyone enjoyed the holiday weekend! We are excited about the final weeks of the 2024-25 school year. It is truly hard to believe that we are planning for the end of the year and the upcoming

school year! I want to remind all of you about two important things related to preparing for the 2025-26 school year.

We are still accepting input regarding your child's class placement. As explained earlier in the month, we recognize that some families may wish to provide input regarding their child's class placement. Our teachers and staff invest significant time and care into this process, ensuring each child is placed in a setting that best supports their growth and success. Our goal is to create balanced classrooms that foster a positive and supportive learning environment for all students.

Please keep the following guidelines in mind when submitting class placement information:

- Share the <u>qualities</u> or <u>teaching styles</u> that best support your child's learning. <u>Specific teacher requests will not be honored</u>.
- If there's a unique situation where your child should not be placed with a particular student, please let us know. We encourage a fresh start each school year—past conflicts don't always mean students won't work well together in the future. We cannot accommodate requests for specific friends.
- Providing input is completely <u>optional!</u> Keeping responses limited helps us maintain the flexibility needed to build well-balanced classrooms.

While we carefully consider all input, we can't guarantee specific placements. Our teachers use their professional judgment to create the best possible learning environments for all students.

How to Submit Input:

All input must be submitted by *next Tuesday*, *April 29th*. Due to the time-intensive nature of this process, **this timeline is important**. Our teachers begin the placement process in May, and timely submissions ensure their careful work is not disrupted.



CALLING ALL RISING HPISD 3RD & 4TH GRADE GIRLS!

Girls on the Run has been empowering $3^{rd} - 8^{th}$ graders for 20 years. We'd love for your rising 3rd & 4th grade girls to be a part of this inaugural program for HPISD!

Who: Girls on the Run for rising HPISD 3rd & 4th grade girls

What: A 11-week evidence-based curriculum that combines exercise (including running) and life skills. At the end of the 11 weeks we complete a 5k together! (In the event of inclement weather during the fall, we will meet and exercise inside).

Where: UP Elementary

When: Every Monday and Wednesday, 3:30 PM - 5:00 PM, starting on Monday, 9/8/25. The season lasts 11 weeks and ends on Wednesday, 11/19/25.

Coaching: Meredith Boyd will be the lead coach. Meredith is a graduate of HPISD and a former HPISD parent. All coaches go through extensive training and background checks.

Extended School Day Information

- ESD is offered by The Academy for Lifelong Learning (A.L.L.) of HPISD and is available for students K – 8 at their school day campuses.
- K-4th grade students receive care from their dismissal time of 3:15 p.m.
 Older children join the ESD program as they are dismissed from class.
 The program includes a snack, quiet time for homework, and supervised group play. ESD ends promptly at 6:00 p.m. each day and follows the HPISD calendar. Part-time enrollment is not available.
- Open enrollment begins Tues., April 1, 2025, at the Academy for Lifelong Learning Office in the Administration Annex Bldg., located at 6915 Westchester (75205).
- The Early Bird Registration fee is \$75 per child, payable by check to Academy for Lifelong Learning, due at the time of enrollment. There is a price increase after April 30, 2025.
- Monthly tuition payments will begin September 1, 2025. Payments are due on the first day of each month and are payable online through your child's Skyward account, or by personal check, bank-drafted check, or money order in the A.L.L. office.
- Registrations must be received in the A.L.L. office by 4:00 p.m., Thursday, August 7, 2025, to begin the program on the first day of school.

Highlander Summer Swim Team Registration is now open!

- Registration is online through HPISD's hometown ticketing website you can access the swim team registration directly <u>here</u>
- The Highlander Summer Swim Team will practice Mondays Thursdays at the HPISD Natatorium from 6/2 to 7/24

- There will be 3 practice groups in the program ranging from 5-19 years age. Groups are determined by skill level and age.
 - Level 1 (ages ~ 5-10) 10:15 11:00 am
 - Level 2 (ages ~ 8-11) 9:00 10:00 am
 - Level 3 (ages ~ 11+) 7:30 8:45 am
 - Group descriptions and requirements can be found <u>here</u>
- From now through April 14th, the cost for participation is \$350 for 8 weeks of practices (it goes up to \$375 on April 15th). Included in that price is...
 - -Facility & Insurance costs
 - -8 weeks of coaching instruction (31 practices ~ 23-39 hours of instruction depending on the group)
 - -Annual AAU Membership
 - -Entry Fees for 3 Swim Meets
 - -Team T-Shirt
 - -Team Latex Cap
- This summer HSST will compete against Frisco ISD's Iron Express AAU team. **Meet dates are 6/13, 6/20, and 7/10.** Meets will all take place in Frisco at the Bruce Eubanks Natatorium starting at 5:30 pm.
- If an athlete wishes to train/participate but not compete in meets, the registration cost is \$250 (going up to \$275 on April 15th). Included in that price is...
