

Dear Armstrong Families,

Happy New Year! I hope each of you had a joyful holiday season! We completed our first semester of this school year, and we have a lot to celebrate. I would like to express my gratitude for your consistent dedication to our school, families, and children. It has been an exciting first semester of the 2025-26 school year. Students are continually engaged in reading and writing instruction, math and science investigations, and collaboration with their peers. Students and staff continue to build strong relationships with each other, and I truly hope that your children come home each day excited about their learning and memorable school experiences!

As you know, Highland Park ISD utilizes a standards-based report card for students in elementary schools. The report card measures a child's progress toward mastery of key objectives/standards of the HPISD curriculum. Standards-based reporting articulates clear, subject-specific grade-level objectives for learning to which a child is striving. The measured objectives and standards including details about the updated reporting scale are outlined in a parent letter available on HPISD's curriculum website found under the Education Services Department ([link](#)).

On Friday afternoon, parents will be able to view your child's second nine weeks report card on Skyward. To view the standards-based report card, access your child's **profile page** in Skyward. On the left side, select **portfolio** and then select **attachments**. Your child's report cards and scores will populate under available student attachments. Highlight **standards-report card** for the appropriate grading period and then **view attachment**. You will be required to sign with an electronic signature before the report card will populate. As teachers administer middle of year assessments, the individual student assessment data will be shared with families in the coming weeks. For more information about your child's progress, contact his/her classroom teacher.

TAG Assessment Registration window is open till 1-12-2026 4pm!


TAG Assessment Registration

Registration for assessment into HPISD TAG occurs once annually for current students.
Registration is currently closed.

A parent/guardian, principal, teacher, counselor, student, or community member may nominate a student for TAG Testing. Individuals that are not parents of a Highland Park student may reach out to the district TAG department to make a nomination. Parents of Highland Park students may complete a nomination by registering their child using the link below. TAG Testing Registration takes place once per academic year for students. New students that tested in the Fall are NOT eligible to test again this academic year. All registration deadlines are firm. Late registrations will not be accepted.


